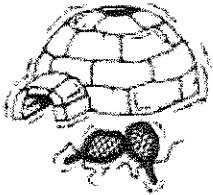


Inuit

The word "igloo" means snowhouse.

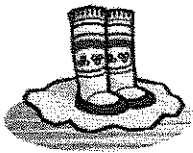
Inuit used to be very nomadic and moved from season to season.

Snowshoes are used for walking over snow.

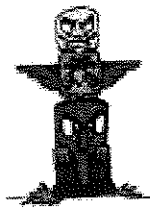


Most Inuit boots are made from caribou fur, sealskin, and reindeer skin. They are called mukluks or kamik.

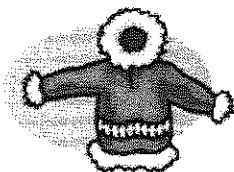


Inuit use small boats called "kayaks."

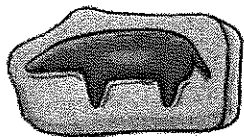
The totem poles made by the Inuit is used as a symbol of protection. It is carved from wood and is painted with many symbols and pretty colors.



The Inuit made their gloves from caribou or sealskin. They lined the inside with fur.



Big, thick coats with large hoods are called parkas.



The Inuit often carved figures from wood and ivory tusks. They also made points for spears and harpoons for fishing and hunting.
